RECYCLING 411

HOW DO I RECYCLE?

Tallahassee residents living in unincorporated Leon County, can recycle by placing items in their green curbside bins, if they subscribe to curbside pick-up service through Waste Management, Inc. (574-3000). Separate paper from other items by placing all paper and paperboard in a brown paper sack. City of Tallahassee residents use their two-sided "smart carts" with paper on one side and cans and bottles on the other side.



WHAT TYPES OF THINGS CAN I RECYCLE?

Newspapers Glass Jars Glass Bottles

Magazines Milk Jugs Paperboard

Aluminum cans Steel cans Cardboard

Phone books White and Colored Paper

All Plastic Bottles and Jugs

REMEMBER:

Remove lids and caps.

Rinse bottles and cans.

No plastic bags.

No butter tubs or yogurt containers.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING (E-cycling)

Computers, televisions, cell phones, PDAs

Due to the toxic materials they contain, these items cannot be disposed of in a landfill. These items should NOT be placed curbside, but instead, brought to the Leon County Solid Waste Management Facility Monday through Saturday from 8am-5pm. LIMITS: One electronic item per resident per day. BUSINESSES: tipping fee will apply.



TIRES



The Leon County SWMF (on Apalachee Parkway) will accept up to four tires from residents at no charge. Tires are shredded and recycled through different venues. *(Permits and Fees apply to commercial haulers).*

PAYMENT FOR ALUMINUM?

Waste Management, Inc., Leon County and the City will NOT pay you for cans. Contact a local scrap dealer to sell your cans.

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

If your scout troop, homeowner's association, school, or other group would like to hear an in-depth presentation on landfill operations, waste reduction or recycling, give Carole Gentry, our Community Education Coordinator a call at 606-1827. Landfill tours are also available.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

Old paint, pesticides, chemicals, used oil, anti-freeze, propane bottles, car batteries, fluorescent bulbs, and rechargeable batteries should be brought to the HHW Center at the Apalachee Parkway location. Check out the Swap Shop while you are there. You can pick up free paint, pesticides and other materials for reuse.
